## **CONFERENCE THEME: EDUCATION BEYOND BOUNDARIES**

The theme provides an opportunity to discuss education beyond all boundaries; such a broad theme can be interpreted liberally to cover aspects of educational research and practice across all sectors involved in education and connected with Education Studies as a flourishing discipline.

Essentially Education Studies is concerned with understanding how people develop and learn throughout their lives, and the nature of knowledge and critical engagement with ways of knowing and understanding. It offers intellectually rigorous analysis of educational processes, systems and approaches, and their cultural, social, political, historical and economic contexts. Other themes include the study of broader perspectives such as international education, economic relationships, the effects of globalisation and the role of human rights and ecological issues. All themes include critique of current policies and practice and a challenge to popular assumptions.

### **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS**

#### **Thursday 1 July 2010**

**Jane Davidson AM**

In 2000, Jane Davidson became the first Minister of Education and Life-Long Learning and Skills of the Welsh Assembly Government, responsible for all aspects of education, training and life-long learning, including Schools, Further Education and Skills development, Higher Education, Youth Service and Careers Service. During this time she was particularly focused on encouraging young people to take part in politics and introduced school councils in every school in Wales and work closely with Funky Dragon, the young people's National Assembly for Wales. She was also responsible for the elimination of SATS and the development of the Foundation Phase.

She became Minister for the Environment, Sustainability and Housing July 2007, and leads on behalf of the Welsh Cabinet on Climate Change and Sustainability.

Prior to entering the Assembly, she worked for the Youth Hostel Association in Wales, ran an anti-poverty organisation and was responsible for health, housing and social care for the Welsh Local Government Association. She is one of the leading environmental campaigners in the UK.

#### **Friday 2 July 2010**

**Prof. Rebecca Wallace**

Professor Wallace is director of the University of Highlands and Islands Centre for on Rural Childhood at Perth College which aims to improve the lives of children locally, nationally and internationally. The Centre focuses on all aspects of childhood issues including health, education, crime, drugs, abuse, sexual exploitation and the experiences of immigrant children - all in a rural context, which is largely ignored in favour of studies into childhood problems in urban situations.

Professor Wallace, is an expert in international law and human rights, brings a wealth of experience to her role as director. Her many distinguished appointments and academic positions include Professor of International Human Rights at Robert Gordon University, Professor of Law and head of the School of Law at Napier University, Edinburgh and senior lecturer and Reader in Law at the University of Strathclyde. She has also been visiting scholar at the John Hopkins University, Washington DC and the Ariel Sallows Professor of Human Rights at the University of Saskatchewan in Canada.

She has an MA from Aberdeen University, an LLB from Dundee University, a Diploma in European Integration from Amsterdam University and a PhD from Glasgow University. She is also a member of the English Bar, Lincoln's Inn, and a Member of the Higher Education Academy, and she serves as a part-time immigration judge. She has written and published papers and handbooks on the international protection afforded to asylum seekers and refugees, specifically women and children, with corporate social responsibility, sustainable development, migration and human rights.

Roedd yn gyfrifol dros bob agwedd ar addysg, hyfforddiant a dysgu gydol oes, yn cynnwys Ysgolion, Addysg Bellach a datblygu sgiliau, Addysg Uwch, Gwasanaethau Ieuenctid a'r Gwasanaeth Gyrfaedd.
